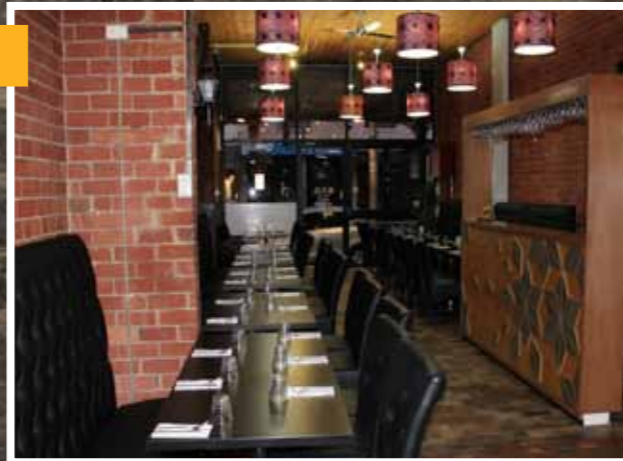


NEW SHOPS on the street

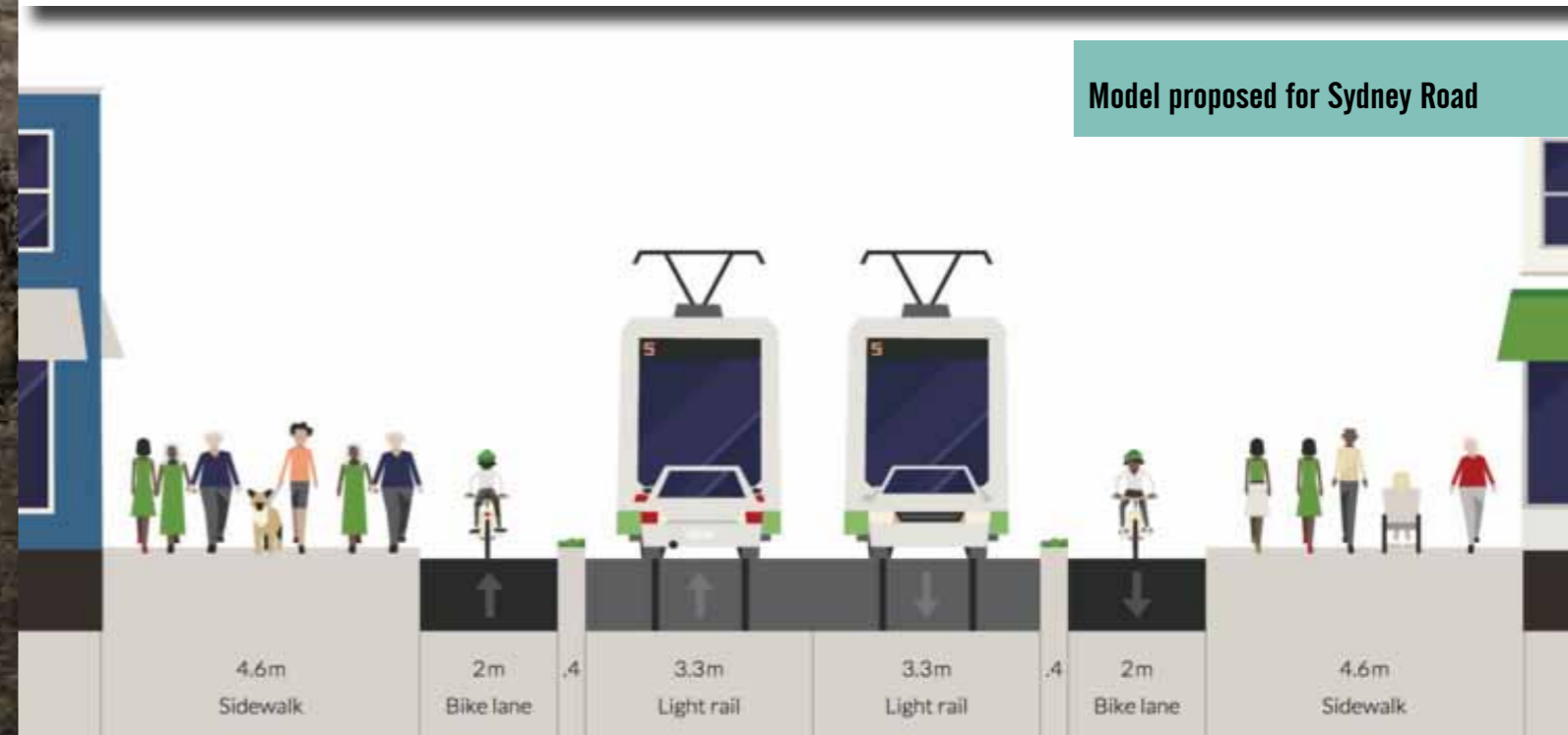

ANZAC DAY - licensed venues

In respect of the solemn observance of ANZAC Day, morning trading hours for some licensed venues are restricted in Victoria. Licensees wishing to trade before noon on the day will need to apply for a temporary limited or major event licence. Applications will be considered by the VCGLR if they satisfy that the supply of alcohol is in connection with commemorative activities and consistent with the respectful commemoration of the day.

What are exempt shops?

Exempt shops are businesses that meet the following criteria:
•they have 20 or fewer persons employed in the shop at any time during a restricted trading day
•the number of persons employed by the business and its related entities is no more than 100 at any time during the seven days immediately before the restricted trading day

Exemptions to restricted trading days

Certain types of business are exempt from any restricted trading days. They can open whenever they wish throughout the year. The types of business that are exempt are:

- chemists
- petrol shops
- restaurants
- cafes
- takeaway outlets
- service providers
- hire outlets (including video stores).
